We will then approve your film being added, if on this list. A distribution deal is included (non-exclusive, no strings attached). Our channel gets good traffic from producers and directors always looking for talent. It is also a great tool to promote your work and you get paid a share of the profits for every new subscriber that joins.

Back to this list, out of the 3 nominees (except for one of the categories, the AFV cat., which has 4), we will be pick an award winner by March 21. The second best will become a wildcard finalist. Winners and wildcards will receive an e-certificate and will be eligible for trophy. Wildcards will become winners of our Outstanding Achievement Award. Both winners and wildcards will be automatically entered into our Best of the Cold gala to be celebrated in May 1 2021 in Green Bay, Wisconsin.
